Booklists for next year

From Sept 2023, the Dept of Education will be introducing a Free Schoolbook Scheme. This means that the school will receive funding to purchase schoolbooks for all children and parents will not need to purchase these. There will still be a charge to all parents to help cover the cost of photocopying, art materials, stationery, insurance and classroom resources.

The Dept of Education is providing €96 per child as part of the Free Schoolbook Scheme. As you will know from experience, this will not cover the cost of the books that the school has been using to date. With this in mind, we will be asking parents to donate certain books that have been used this year so that they can be used again next year by other children, to help keep costs down.

We will send a message to each class informing parents of the books we would like to keep in school to form part of our book scheme for next year. Your class teacher will be in contact about this shortly.

Home Based Summer Programme

Some children with additional needs will be able to avail of the Home-Based Summer Programme during July and August. At this point, the Dept of Education have not released any information about who will be eligible and how to apply. As soon as I have an update on this, I will inform parents.

School Calendar

The school calendar for next year is being finalised and will be released shortly.

School policy updates

The annual Child Safeguarding Statement and Anti bullying review has taken place. These will be added to the website over the next few days. The staff have also updated a number of other policies this term. The updated Code of Behaviour will be on the website over the next few days. Early Collections

We have seen a large increase in the number of early collections from school in recent months. Please note that children should only be collected early from school if:

- 1. The child needs to attend a medical appointment that cannot be arranged out of school hours.
- 2. There is a family emergency If you need to collect your child early, you need to inform your child's teacher beforehand. Collections cannot take place between 1 and 1:30 pm as the office is closed for lunch. All early collections are recorded as part of the child's yearly attendance.

School Tours

You have received information from your class teacher about the upcoming school tours. You will also have received a payment link on the Aladdin app. You will appreciate there is a huge amount of organising that goes into the sixteen school tours. We ask that parents make the payment online as soon as possible to ensure we have everything organised for the day of the tours. Payment for school tours need to be made online. If you have any queries regarding your tour, please contact your teacher directly.

Standardised Tests

Children in classes from Senior infants to 6th class will be taking part in standardised testing in areas such as Literacy, Numeracy and Spelling over the coming weeks. It is really important that children are in attendance for these tests as they help us track progress and set targets for the year ahead. Obviously, if your child is unwell, they should not attend school. You do not need to prepare your child for these tests, and you will receive feedback on the results in the end of year reports.


Reminder that children should not be on the school grounds before 8:50 am. There is staggered drop off from 8:50-9:00 am.
